MEETING MINUTES
February 13, 2025

CALL TO ORDER: President Kathryn Long called the Meeting of the Centre Hall Borough Council to order at 7:00 p.m.

CITIZENS: The Daughenbaugh Family presented their issues to PennDOT with having no signs on PA Ave or crosswalks which they believe was a factor to their son being hit by a car in earlier months. Tom Prestash stated crosswalks are locally decided & maintained by Municipality. PennDOT will be in contact with Penns Valley to get bus stop areas. After discussing crosswalks, we moved into the water issue on PA Ave. PennDOT is trying to find solutions for drainage issue. PennDOT will meet with Kenny Strouse to identify the water issue and configure a plan. Borough would like PennDOT to vacuum the grates to help with water issue, as well. PennDOT also agreed to install a digital speed limit sign on PA Ave to help reduce the speed traffic.

Mayor Young is taking action on issue.
